CHARACTERISTICS OF DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY


- Place where individual rights are important but the majority rules.

One of the principal goals of this society is to protect basic human rights as : freedom of speech, freedom of religion and everyone is equal under the law.

- Boys and girls are equal (they have the same rights).

WHO GOVERNS ?

- Saudi Arabia is a monarchy based on Islam. A king rules the country with the help of the prince, his assistant. There are also 22 ministers that each have a specialty, for example, education.

The population cannot participate to decision making.

JUSTICE

Because Saudi Arabia is an Islamic country, their justice system is based on the Islamic law (Sharia). The king is at the top of the legal system, he is always

The accused person is considered guilty unless she is able to prove her innocence. But often, the person doesn't know what she is accused of and she doesn't have access to a lawyer or to the evidence against her.

If the person is judged guilty, the punishment is often corporal punishment: decapitation, stoning, amputation, and flagellation.

Death penalty : for murder, rape, stealing, adultery, witchcraft

Amputation: right hand for stealing and right hand plus a foot for stealing with violence

Flagellation: for non-respect of religion rules like taking alcohol or non respect of prayers or fast during Ramadan.

Testimony of a non- musulman person is not take into consideration and the testimony of a woman is worth half of the testimony of a man.

Half of death penalty are practiced on foreign residents.

The people don't vote for the king.

Although, there are municipal elections. Men have the right to vote and women will have the right to vote for the first time in the 2015 elections.



- 1791 : Everybody can vote.
- 1875: Only men can vote.
- -1940 : Women have the right to vote.

-1963 : 18 years old can vote (before it was 21 years old)

- 1969 The Native people can vote



Religion





The only religion that can be practiced in Saudi Arabia is Islam even if close of a million of Christians live there (the Christians that live there are mostly foreign workers).

There, there are no churches and the buildings to pray that aren't Muslim are prohibited.

There is also a Saudi religion police that inspects the house of the Christians frequently.

The foreign workers need to respect the Ramadan and they do not have the right to celebrate Christmas or Easter.

The consequence of someone that is Muslim and that converts to another religion is death. Everyone can choose the religion they want to practice. The citizens can also choose to not believe in any religion.







Gay people

Saudi Arabia is one of the few countries where homosexuality is not only illegal, but you can be killed for it.

There, several hundreds of people have been arrested for behaving like women.

The most popular consequences are stoning and jail.



Gay people are respected.

Each year, in August, there is a gay festival in Montreal.

In Quebec the gay mariage is autorised since march 18 2004.





Men

Men wear a traditional dress called a thobe, which has been called the Wahhabi national dress.

Women

In public, all women are required to wear a long black cloak that covers all but the hands and face called an abaya .

They also wear a niquab that covers the face except the eyes.





Everyone is free to dress as they want.







FREEDOM OF SPEECH





They don't have the right to critic Islam, religion , the government, and the royal family.

Public manifestations are prohibited.

The articles in the journals are censored.

A major part of the internet is blocked.



In Quebec, we have the right to say what we want.





HOW DOES QUEBEC HELP THE DEMOCRACY IN ARABIA???

Canada and Saudi Arabia have trade agreements. Saudi Arabia is a major buyer of military equipment in Canada. In addition, it is an ally in the fight against Islamic State.

So Canada tolerates the non-respect of human rights in this country which is not helpful for democracy.



WHAT THE INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY DOES TO PROMOTE DEMOCRACY IN SAUDI ARABIA?

USA have a pact with Saudi Arabia since 1945 that stipulates that USA protect the territory and the royal family in exchange of a guarantee in oil supply. More recently, Saudi Arabia is an important ally in the fight against Islamic State. All the occidental countries tolerate the fact that human rights are not respected in Saudi Arabia. For them, political and financial issues seem to be more important than moral issues. But many countries complain about the non-respect of human rights in Africain countries, countries with which there is no business agreement.
